



Pete Lien & Sons, Inc. Scholarship Application

Qualifications, Criteria & Eligibility

The applicant must be a child or grandchild of a current full-time employee of Pete Lien & Sons and must attend (or plan to attend) an accredited college, university, recognized trade, vocational or similar school. High school seniors, college freshmen and sophomores cumulative Grade Point Average (G.P.A.) must be at least 2.75. College juniors and seniors cumulative G.P.A. must be at least 3.0. Applicant must complete the scholarship application in its entirety and submit a current official transcript. Applicant must be a full-time student and maintain full-time status as defined by the institution (minimum of 12 credit hours).

Two deserving recipients will be selected after the June 15 deadline. These recipients must maintain the required G.P.A. and submit their semester transcripts by August 15 and January 1 to maintain eligibility and receipt of scholarship funds. Scholarship eligibility may be regained following any semester in which the minimum G.P.A. is obtained.

The financial awards granted under this program will not exceed eight regular semesters which must be completed within five (5) calendar years of high school graduation and will be discontinued if the student recipient voluntarily withdraws from school for a semester, unless the withdrawal is because of a documented illness.

If a recipient must withdraw from school due to a documented illness, the overall G.P.A. attained during the semester will not be counted toward academic eligibility. The financial grant awarded for a semester in which the recipient must withdraw from school due to a documented illness will be included in the eight semesters of academic eligibility.

The scholarship award will be disbursed in the amount of \$2,500 per semester. These funds will be sent directly to the college business office.

A committee assigned by the President of Pete Lien & Sons, Inc. will review the first-time applicants eligible for the Fall Semester. The President will review the current scholarship recipient's transcripts to determine further continued support.

First time applicant's deadline is June 15.

Current scholarship recipient's transcripts deadlines are August 15 and January 1.
